Education

James Barker 1931 - 2019

Born Sydney 1931 and educated at Knox Grammar School Wahroonga. He studied at East Sydney Technical College graduating in 1955. From 1957 - 68 James lived in Florence, Italy and travelled extensively in Europe. He studied at the Accademia dei Belle Arti in Florence and with Kokoschka in Salzburg. He taught Higher Mathematics at Miss Barry's American School and English as a foreign language for the British Institute of Florence and the Università Popolare. In 1966 he opened his own studio in Florence for the instruction of painting and drawing.

He returned to Australia in 1968 and taught at the National Art School, University of New South Wales under Miss Lorna Nimmo and the University of Sydney with Dr Lloyd Rees. Tutored for Adult Education and the Arts Council of Australia.

He held a number of exhibitions at the Macquarie Galleries, Woollahra Gallery, Painters Gallery - Sydney, Toorak Art Gallery - Melbourne as well as other shows in conjunction with his then wife Elisabeth Cummings at Orange, Berrima, Canberra and at the Blaxland Gallery - Sydney.

He was awarded the Fullbright Scholarship for further studies in 1956 and was a finalist in the Wynne Prize in 1968; awarded the Human Image Prize (Royal Easter Show), Fisher's Ghost Prize Campbelltown, Leichhardt Prize (double first), Lismore Prize, Narrabri Prize, Berrima Prize, Nepean River Jubilee Prize, Portland Art Prize and the Camden Art Prize in 1976, 1979 and 1982
